The V&E Greenline is a community park, owned and operated by volunteers. It is 1.7 miles long, covers 10.5 acres, and provides opportunities for recreation, healthy living, and neighborhood revitalization.

Volunteers from VECA, other areas of the city, and Greenline users maintain the V&E Greenline without compensation. They perform over 2,000 hours of community service each year.

Funds are needed for maintenance and improvement costs. The V&E Greenline can continue only if area residents and Greenline users provide financial support and volunteer time for maintenance work.



Greenline users will forever be thankful to community partner Keeler Ironworks who donated the construction and installation of two bridges, one at Lick Creek and one at West Creek—named Keeler Bridge.

Greenline Stationhouse

The V&E Greenline Stationhouse was designed to be a historic 1860s building to house the maintenance equipment, serve as a central meeting place, and be the center of our small neighborhood park. Construction of the building shell was completed in 2006. The V&E Greenline Committee needs to raise \$3,200 to retire the construction debt on this beautiful and functional building.
